make changes as needed. Village members for the Soft Start are prepared with the expectation of possible glitches and are set to provide feedback and personal insight. In exchange for their participation the normal membership fees will be waived.

At the end of the Soft Start, we will be opening SLO village for all qualifying seniors. Membership

Currently, we are looking for seniors who need our services. If you know of someone who is looking for more social interaction or may have a need for transportation or other assistance, let us know. We will contact this person and jointly determine if their needs are addressed by the services we offer.

During our soft start (trial period) there will be no charge for membership.

Associate Membership

Associate members receive no services, but can attend all social events. They are both social and financial supporters of SLO Village. Associate Members can instantly become full Members if the need arises. Associate Members receive no services, therefore their membership fees are tax deductible.

Subsidized Memberships

SLO Village realizes that the membership fees may be out of reach for some seniors. It is our desire not to deny access to our Village because of financial limitations. Our village does have a limited number of Subsidized Memberships for those cases. We are also looking for financial sponsors in order to increase the number of Subsidized Memberships.

Membership Fees

Single Membership	\$500 annually/\$138 quarterly
Household Memberships	\$750 annually/\$206 quarterly
Associate Memberships	\$250 annually/\$69 quarterly
Subsidized Memberships	\$250 annually/\$69 quarterly

The cost of membership is based on operational expenses of SLO Village. Staff, insurance and social events are our largest expenses.
